Chair's Report

It has been a privilege to have taken over the role as Chair this year. Within the Covid restrictions, which has limited the activities and services of the GP Network, the Board is focussing on life after Covid. It has been pleasing that GPs have been recognised as the key interface between the health system and they remain the most trusted professionals. A recent study has shown that people with regular GPs have longer and healthier life.

In March of this year the Board undertook a Governance Refresher Course. One of the many things to come out of this was the need to keep in focus the two key directions of the GP Network

Our Purpose: To facilitate better health of the community by supporting excellence in General Practice and Primary Health Care.

Our Vision: To be the lead organisation in the Nepean area that promotes and supports General Practice in providing optimum Primary Health Care to the community.

We are reminded that The GP network is the only GP Association in the Penrith LGA that is able and does advocate for its GP members. Along with our Health Consumers Advisory Committee we constantly advocate and promote the value of GPs within our Community and beyond.

A particular emphasis this year has been to understand and promote the benefits of the COVID Vaccination program. We are pleased that as of 7 November 2021 the Penrith LGA has recorded greater than 95% first dose and 92.1% second dose. This is indeed a job well done by all health providers for our community. Our next challenge is the approved Booster shots

We believe that in the eyes of the general Practitioner and their patients that Telehealth is widely accepted as a supplementary means to conduct a consultation in isolation. It has been a useful tool that complements face to face consultation and examination. We would advocate that remains an MBS item number.

Conducting CPD events remain a challenge under the COVID restrictions. During the reporting year we were only able to conduct three Zoom events . These being: Dr Sally Poulton-ADHD, Dr Pavitar Sunner - Management of Shoulder Problems and Dr Monique Heinke, Breast Cancer Case Studies

We continue to work on a CPD Accredited Activity (Cat1) event on Mental Health.

The Board has agreed to engaging an external facilitator to breathe new life into the NGPN and to explore avenues of value add to General Practice and new revenue streams.
